CREDIT TRANSFER

This document provides an overview of the credit structure and workload of the Sports and Physiotherapy Program hosted by Universitas Udayana. The program follows the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System. One credit point represents an estimated workload of thirty hours. The full program awards a maximum of thirty ECTS credits.

The program is delivered over fifteen weeks. It includes lectures, workshops, practical training sessions, guest lectures, academic excursions, and guided self study. Students receive an official academic transcript and certificate upon successful completion.
